

Information pursuant to EU Reg 2016/679 (European Data Protection Regulation)

Pursuant to Article 13 of EU Reg. 2016/679 (hereinafter, GDPR), this privacy policy describes the personal data processing activities (hereinafter, the 'Data') carried out via the ohwell.co.uk website. (hereinafter, the 'Site').

1. Data Controller.

The Data Controller is Ohwell S.r.l. with sole shareholder, (Fiscal Code and P.I. 10680150967), with registered office in Milan, Via della Posta 10 (the Data Controller).

2. Type of data processed and legal basis for processing

The following personal data (Data) are collected and processed through the Site:

- (i) personal data relating to navigation, processed for the sole purpose of enabling the Site to function properly. In this regard, the User is invited to read the specific Cookie policy present on the Site.

The legal basis for the processing of navigation data functional to the correct use of the Site is based on the need to allow the use of the Site itself.

- (ii) data provided voluntarily by the User, by sending e-mails and/or filling in forms on the pages of the Site processed in order to

- request the booking of services offered by Ohwell (name, surname, email);
- request subscription to the newsletter offered by Ohwell (name, surname, email).

The legal basis for these processing operations is, in the first case, the need to respond to the User's requests and, in the second case, the specific consent given by the User.

3) Storage of personal data

Data are kept for the time strictly necessary for the pursuit of the purposes indicated in this information notice and will be deleted at the end of this period, unless the data must be kept for legal obligations or to enforce a right in court.

5) Scope of communication of Data to third parties

The Data Controller communicates personal data collected through the Site in accordance with the provisions of the law and following the procedures set out below.

In particular, the User's personal data may be processed and known by

- a) employees and consultants of the Data Controller in their capacity as persons authorised to process data and instructed to do so by the Data Controller itself;
- b) companies that perform specific services on behalf of the Controller as data processors appointed by the Controller or as autonomous data controllers.

The User's data may also be disclosed to the police or to judicial authorities, in accordance with the law and subject to a formal request by such entities or where there are reasonable grounds to believe that the disclosure of such data is reasonably necessary to (i) investigate, prevent or take action regarding suspected unlawful activities or to assist state control and supervisory authorities; (ii) defend against any claims or accusations by third parties, or protect the security of the Site and of the Controller itself.

6) Data processing methods

Personal data collected through the Site are processed using methods and instruments that are mainly computerised and telematic, adopting security measures so as to minimise the risks of destruction or loss, even accidental, of the data themselves, of unauthorised access or processing that is not permitted or does not comply with the purposes of collection as indicated in this Privacy Policy. However, due to the nature of the online medium of transmission, these measures cannot limit or exclude absolutely any risk of unauthorised access or loss of data. To this end, we recommend that you periodically check that your computer is equipped with appropriate software devices for the protection of network data transmission, both incoming and outgoing (such as up-to-date antivirus systems) and that your Internet service provider has taken appropriate measures for the security of network data transmission (such as firewalls and spam filters).

Data is not transferred outside the European Economic Area.

8) Rights of Data Subjects

Articles 15-22 GDPR give Data Subjects the possibility to exercise specific rights.

In particular:

- the right to obtain confirmation of the existence or non-existence of Data concerning them, even if not yet recorded, and its communication in intelligible form;
- the right to obtain information regarding the origin of the Data; the purpose and method of processing; the logic applied in the event of processing carried out with the aid of electronic instruments; the identification details of the data controller and data processors; the indication of the subjects or categories of subjects to whom the Data may be communicated or who may become aware of it
- the right to request the updating, rectification or, when interested, the integration of the Data, the cancellation, the transformation into anonymous form; the limitation of the treatment
- the right to Data portability
- the right to withdraw consent previously given, limited to processing based on the provision of consent
- the right to object in whole or in part, on legitimate grounds, to the processing of Data, even if pertinent to the purpose of collection
- the right to lodge a complaint with the supervisory authority (Garante Privacy), without prejudice to the right to appeal in any other administrative or judicial forum, should they consider that the Data processing conducted by the Data Controller is in breach of the GDPR.
